Greg Parson repaired Chuck Blooms driveway as discussed at annual meeting. Greg also

suggested we install blue reflectors where additional water supply is available for fire-fighting. Anthony will order more white and blue reflectors, as well as recycle white reflectors that have come loose from the road.

Chair – Jim Blankenhorn

Brush and Tree Trimming:

- Discussed establishing suggested standards/guidelines for maintaining tree and shrubs a certain distance from the road to eliminate cars hitting them when passing other vehicles.
- Anthony will survey road and identify spots of concern.

Danny Estin to investigate the recent sale of a portion of the Garfinkel property adjacent to the Salyer property. Items of concern:

- Did we get notification from the County on this property?
- Need to be fully informed for emergency contacts and dues.
- New owner contact information
- New Contract of Easement

The newly elected Board will continue to address the 3 parcels delinquent on their annual dues.

Research will be done regarding Corporate vs. Liability insurance to decide what would benefit the association best.

Bill Croker will look into an easily managed, free accounting software.

A Committee of Bill Croker and Anthony Prescott will put a plan together for the type/location of the trial speed hump. The plan will then be:

- Approved by the Board.
- WWRA members will be notified before trial starts.
- Ballot will be issued to all members in order to gather feedback.
- Final proposal issued to members for vote.

Suggested time frame for trial period:

- November installation of speed hump for trial
- December, members will assess the like/dislike of driving over the speed hump.
- Final vote no later than (NLT) March.

Karen Gifford – Nevada County District 4 representative, Hank Westin responded to the inquiry at the annual meeting regarding a turn lane installed on Pleasant Valley road. After a traffic study was completed, results indicate the traffic not congested enough to warrant a turn lane. However, after the installation of the sewer pipe, the shoulder of the road will be widened enough to pass on the right.

NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Chair</u> – Need to look into updating the By-Laws. Current By-Laws are out of date.

Due to the average 8 minute emergency response time to our road, the District Office is offering an 8 hour CPR certification course, at the cost of \$50. Let a Board member know of any interest.

No permits are required for speed humps due to Wildwood West being a private, however, District office also relayed that Emergency vehicles prefer no speed humps due to damage to vehicles.

Robert and Shelly Bell have moved back into their home permanently. Both sides of their driveway are on a blind curve. Should we put up blind curve signs? What signs would impact more obedience/safety?

<u>Vice Chair</u> – will investigate plans/auto response systems for cell phones on the call tree regarding emergency information i.e., fire/medical.

<u>Karen Gifford</u> – Questions regarding Tributary Roads, and the possibility of members getting extra personal work done to their driveway/roads when the repaying is taking place.
